Celebrate Spring: Earth Day

Wildflower Seed Bombs

This sensory activity can turn into a fun project to continue to observe through spring and summer!

Blend construction paper and water until it becomes pulp. It should be mushy but still stick together. Add packet if wild flower seeds.

At this point, allow the kids to feel the 'dough' and play with it while molding it into small balls. Set out to dry and plant or send home for a sweet gift!



Rock Garden

A lovely addition to your seed bombs is some hand painted rocks that can be collected on a nature walk. The littlest kids can have some painting fun with a sensory Ziploc bag filled with paint while the older kids do their rock painting.



Newspaper Watercolors

This craft is a great chance to use up your old newspapers and inspire creativity for all ages!

Give each child a sheet of newspaper and allow them to paint with water colors. You can use their finished product to make flowers to hang in your program, cards for mothers day, create owls with some additional cutting and pasting for older children. The possibilities are endless!

Sullivan County Public Health
Services is committed to promoting

partial service local health department
with a workforce of over 7 employees
to meet the health needs of our
community. We offer nursing,
physical therapy, occupational
therapy, Healthy Families, Children
With Special Health Care Needs,
bilingual outreach workers, The Rural
Health Network and administrative
staff.

Sullivan County Public Health
Services offers a Certified Home
Health Agency which includes home
care to newborns and mothers
eligible for maternal infant care
services, young children and adults in
need of at-home care, elder patients
in need of skilled nursing, patients in
need of wound care after surgery and
individuals with disabilities in need of
daily living and other forms of selfcare.

Sullivan County Public Health Education Center offers community presentations on health-related topics, improves community awareness of public health issues, collaboration between community organizations to improve health outcomes.

The Rural Health Network is a collaborative group of organizations who work together to address the health needs of our community. We coordinate health and human services with our community partners to work together to leverage limited resources, and to ensure an effective and efficient service delivery system to improve health outcomes.



Sullivan County Public Health Services continued to see a decline in active Covid-19 cases over the past few days. There are a total of 159 active cases in the County, 586 in quarantine, 4 hospitalized and 66 deaths. Since March 2020 there have been 4,325 confirmed cases. To date, eight (8) vaccination clinics have been held since we began to receive vaccine on January 20, with a total of 1,509 individuals receiving their first dose. Today we vaccinated 224 essential workers. Tomorrow we will vaccinate at least another 100.

The 1,509 total included a one-time allocation for 600 seniors 65+ and additional vaccines for essential workers in category 1b. Those seniors and essential workers vaccinated the week of January 20 will be brought back for their second vaccines starting February 17, essentially doubling the number of clinics we're holding weekly going forward, for residents receiving both first and second doses.

We will also continue to see a 20% increase in our weekly allocation from the state. Many county staff and community volunteers are already being used to staff our clinics to assist our core public health staff operating clinics. To sign up to volunteer go to www.health.ny.gov/ServNY and select "Sullivan County, NY." Sullivan County Public Health Services receives COVID vaccines from New York State and is required to distribute them in accordance with NYS Vaccine Distribution Guidelines.

The weekly allocations are designated by New York State to county health departments for specific populations and although new "eligible individuals" continue to be added by the state, we must follow the guidance we are given each week for how to distribute the vaccine we receive.

At this time we are unable to vaccinate additional individuals 65 and older because the state has not given us permission to do so. Pharmacies are designated to vaccinate 65 and older and will be receiving vaccine from NYS. Please call your local pharmacy to see when they will be receiving vaccine. The Medicine Shoppe in Liberty and Riverside Remedies in Callicoon have limited vaccine available and residents can visit their websites or call them directly for more information on how to sign up.

This week Sullivan County Public Health was allocated 300 doses. The doses are allocated for 1b essential workers. Garnet Health Medical Center- Catskills is continuing to vaccinate individuals in category 1a. health care workers. Sun River Health Care will be vaccinating additional residents. We expect additional doses will be allocated to our area health care partners and pharmacies in the coming weeks and will share information in a coordinated manner as it becomes available.

HAPPY CACFP Week March 14—20 2021

Our providers, you, have done an incredible job continuing to run smoothly despite all the challenges brought on by COVID. Here are a few tips that may help you address some of these new challenges brought on by accepting school age children and their inconsistent schedules.

Coordinating schedules and facilitating online school is difficult and unfamiliar. When implementing the CACFP program, remember:

- Despite age, all children should be offered the same foods. Being that this is a unique situation, I understand that the serving of meals may stagger. If you are concerned about meal staggering, please let me know.
- Be sure that all enrollments are up to date and reflect current meals.
- Keep attendance records up to date on school days and non-school days. Keeping all records accurate helps to prevent "error codes".
- Make sure enrollments reflect the school of attendance, if any.
- Encourage school age children to help you create meals. This is a great opportunity for them to gain access to the kitchen, learn about ingredients, learn how to spot whole grains and to use measurement tools. Hands on learning can be a welcome change of pace for the children and for you.
- Use mealtimes to engage with the school age children about how they feel during these challenging times. Include them in regular mealtime conversations so they feel like part of the program. Help them with proper manners and expectations.

It is normal to feel overwhelmed with all the additional responsibilities that come with accepting school age children. Set boundaries that will keep the older children involved while protecting the younger children in your program. Thank you for all you do always.

SPOTLIGHT On: COVID Vaccine

Please see this month's Dear Provider Letter for more detailed information.

WHO:

•Owners, Operators and staff of OCFS licensed and registered child care programs.

•Providers and staff of Legally Exempt Group Child Care programs

Unlicensed, unregistered, informal or legally exempt home-based providers of child care are **NOT** eligible at this time.

HOW

As reported on the "COVID-19 Vaccine: Safe, Effective, Free" https://covid19vaccine.health.ny.gov/ (2021)

Step 1: Go to the: Am I Eligible app to see if you're eligible and make an appointment. You can also call the New York State COVID-19 Vaccination Hotline at 1-833-NYS-4-VAX (1-833-697-4829). Once you have successfully scheduled an appointment, you will receive a confirmation email that contains a barcode. You will need to bring this to your appointment.

Step 2: Complete the Vaccine Form. Once you have a confirmed appointment, you must complete the New York State COVID-19 Vaccine Form. This form should be filled out online and you will receive a submission ID indicating completion. You will need to bring the submission ID to your appointment. If you cannot submit the form online, it will be available at the vaccination sites.

Step 3: Bring proof of eligibility to your appointment. Depending on your eligibility category, proof can include an employee ID card, a letter from an employer or affiliated organization, a pay stub, a driver's license, passport, or any legal proof of your date of birth and residency. At the time of your appointment, you'll be asked a series of clinical questions to ensure readiness for a vaccine. You will be asked for insurance information BUT the vaccine is free and there will never be a charge to you. This information is for administrative use only. (Daycare providers should bring their license or registration as proof (Regional Office, 2021)

Step 4: Your second dose appointment will be scheduled automatically when you receive your first vaccine dose. Your second appointment will be scheduled for the same time and at the same location, three weeks following your first dose. You will receive a card onsite with the date and time indicated and a confirmation email will follow a few days later. Please keep in mind when scheduling your first appointment that your second appointment will occur at the same time of day.

What you will need to bring with you to your appointment recap:

- Copy of the confirmation email with barcode
- Submission ID
- Proof of eligibility
- If Daycare staff, fulltime/ part time / substitute/teacher etc.. letter from the employer or employee id
- For Home based providers your license / Registration.
- Insurance Information

All though it does not say so on the website a basic form of ID is always recommended such as Drivers License, Passport or Identification Card

The Office Of Children and Family Services has not mandated that all providers are required to have the vaccine. The Department of Health does however, strongly recommend it if you are medically able to.

Is it included in the 30 hour requirement or added to the 30 hours. I am hoping you can help me, please?

Dear So Confused,

Thanks for the question. The training topic entitled Adverse Childhood Experiences, Focused on Understanding Trauma and Nurturing Resiliency, was introduced into training requirements in January as the 10th topic. Currently, The Office of Children and Family Services is diligently working on the implementation of the availability of the training to providers. They ask that all programs be patient and they will notify everyone when the process is concluded. Until such time, we have been granted a grace period. In addition, this training is included in the 2 year / 30 hour requirement. So no worries, we got you!

Child Care Time & Attendance (CCTA)

Submit your timesheets online with the Child Care Time & Attendance (CCTA) System!

We encourage all providers to submit timesheets through the web-based system, CCTA.

There are several *benefits to using CCTA* web-based provider portal such as:

- ⇒ Eliminate the cost of shipping, mailing and purchasing paper products and postal supplies.
- ⇒ Eliminate time delay of using the postal service.
- ⇒ TRACK PAYMENTS ON A DAILY BASIS.

It is recommended to use Internet Explorer on desktops or laptops. Most iPads and other hand held tablets are not supported by this system

REMINDER – ALL timesheets have a 60 expiration date from the last date of service. ANY TIMESHEETS that are RECEIVED AFTER the 60 expiration date (electronically or paper) will be RETURNED to provider as NOT PAYABLE

Legally Exempt News

Tips for Enrollment:

- -MUST have a subsidy approved family
- -MUST submit a complete enrollment packet (all boxes/ sections must be checked/filled out, even if it is N/A)
 - -Non-Relative providers MUST complete preservice training & provider certificate
 - -Non-Relative providers MUST complete a comprehensive background check
- -Relative providers ONLY include: Grandparent or Greatgrandparent, Sibling who is living in a separate residence, Aunt or Uncle
 - -To be classified as "In-Home", care **MUST** be done in the child's home, **not** the providers
 - -Enrollment process may take up to 40 days

Name of Product: Excedrin Migraine Caplets, Excedrin Migraine Geltabs, Excedrin Extra Strength Caplets, Excedrin PM Headache Caplets, and Excedrin Tension Headache Caplets

Childhood & Adolescent Immunization Schedules for 2021 Released

The AAP has released the 2021 Immunization Schedule. With it's release, they have issued some guidelines to encourage all parents to get their children up to date with their immunizations as COVID rages on. Here are some highlights from the AAP article released on February 11, 2021

- Pediatricians are concerned that many children remain behind in their vaccines amid the COVID-19 pandemic and urge families to schedule their appointments to catch up.
- The AAP policy statement, "Recommended Childhood and Adolescent Immunization Schedule: United States, 2021," describes the timetable for administering vaccinations during stages of a child's development that have proven to be safe and effective at preventing specific diseases.
- The Vaccine schedule includes a catch-up immunization schedule for those ages 4 months through 18 years who start late or are more than one month behind the recommended age for vaccine administration.
- A COVID-19 vaccine for children under age 16 is not yet available. Pharmaceutical companies have just begun
 enrolling younger children in clinical trials to evaluate safety, and currently the trials include only children 12 and
 older.
