Backpack Safety & Tips

Whether it's their first year in school or an adult using a backpack to carry every day items, here are a few things to consider.

- Pack light a backpack should never weigh more than 15% of a person's body weight.
- Choose a pack with wide, padded shoulder straps and a padded back.
- Always use both shoulder straps. Slinging a backpack over one shoulder can strain muscles and may increase curvature of the spine.
- Organize the items inside so that heavier items are low and towards the center of the backpack
- Position of the backpack is slightly below your shoulders and above your hips.

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Featured Agency: Leadership Sullivan– Sullivan County Chamber Foundation

Want to get to know the county you live and/or work in just a little bit better and make a difference while you are at it? Maybe gain some new skills and new colleagues along the way - even do some good? Then give Leadership Sullivan serious consideration this year.

For over 20 years - Leadership Sullivan - a project of The Sullivan County Chamber of Commerce Foundation - has annually introduced professionals from business, nonprofits and government sectors to the length and breadth of all Sullivan County has to offer. Each year a class of no more than 20 people is recruited and then taken on a journey of discovery. Class members meet with business owners, government officials and community thought leaders on their 9 month journey across Sullivan County.

Our approach is two tiered. First it is subject based covering such county centered issues such as Agriculture, Tourism, Government, Healthcare, Community Development, Law Enforcement, Human Services, Media and more. It is also regional as we travel each month to one of 6 different regions in the county. It helps demonstrate how each region has its own flavor, while offering unique resources to the rest of the county. While there, the class learns about the particulars of that region and what set of issues is most important to them, or how for example tourism is a little different for Narrowsburg than it is for Monticello. As the class progresses the participants gain a further and deeper knowledge of all that makes Sullivan County tick, building new contacts and new insights as they go.

Second tier, each class is also tasked with a service project selecting a local charity or cause, then creating a fundraiser or other project that helps give that charity a boost. Prasad Children's Dental Health Program was this past year's chosen charity, receiving a big public relations boost on local media, an outdoor event in Hurlevville and over \$5,000 in donations collected for the cause. Through such projects, class members learn how to give back to the county that sustains their work and livelihood.

New for this year - Leadership Sullivan is in the final stages of introducing a richer leadership training component to our curriculum. Class after class has raved about all they have learned about the county, but have requested a deeper dive into learning more about leadership itself. We will soon be announcing the incorporation of 6 sessions on leadership incorporated into the class year led by a prominent and experienced regional thought leader with deep ties to Sullivan County. Look for announcements to come.



Signing up is easy - go to the Leadership Sullivan web page listed below to fill out your form. Class tuition is \$500 with some scholarship support available - see the web page for details Many local businesses, organizations and government agencies have sponsored tuition for past class members as an opportunity for their career development. Some of these include Sullivan County Government, Foster Supply Hospitality, Jeff Bank, ARC, New Hope Community, Garnet Health and more. Talk to your employer or human resources department about how they might be able to assist you. Class commitment is easy - It starts with a single overnight orientation at Villa Roma September 10-11, then monthly classes, generally the second Tuesday of the month, running October through May with a graduation event in June. Some additional time may be required for discussions on class projects, but generally the total commitment is about 8-10 hours per month.

Registration is now open and seats are going fast. Again, the class is limited to 20 only, so once the seats are gone, they are gone. Click this link to learn more. Child and Adult Care Food Program (CACFP) News

The following rates are effective from July 1, 2023—June 30, 2024. The Keeps Kids Fed act (KKFA) expired on June 30, 2023. Therefore, the temporary funding of an additional 10 cents per meal and snack is no longer available. In addition, Tier II family or group day care homes will return to Tier II reimbursement rates, rather than receive the Tier I rates they received while the KKFA was in effect.

Sullivan County Child Care Council is currently offering trainings for <u>FREE</u> to all Sullivan County licensed, registered, & enrolled providers.

CPR/FA requires a deposit of \$65 to hold your spot, but will be returned upon completion of the course as long as you are an active licensed, registered or legally exempt enrolled provider.

Health & Safety Training requires a deposit of \$175 for group family and family and \$225 for all others. Your deposit will be returned upon receipt of your license, registration, or legally exempt enrollment if you are open with 60 days.

Educational Incentive Program (EIP)

EIP is sponsored by the NYSOCFS, funded by the federal Child Care & Development Fund and administered by the Professional Development Program (PDP), Rockefeller College, University at Albany.

The following grants & scholarships are available to child care providers:

- College Credit, Non-Credit Bearing & Credential Training: to assist child care providers in paying for professional development training & education
- Cardiopulmonary Resuscitation (CPR) & First Aid (FA): to assist income eligible providers offset the cost
- The MAT Rebate Program: For child care facilities to offset the cost of the training to certify staff to administer medication in a child care setting.

SPOTLIGHT: Child Care Definition / Enforcement

Section 413.1. Scope

The definitions in this Part apply to all references to day care programs included in this Title. The provisions in this Part governing enforcement and hearings apply to all child day care programs addressed in Parts 414, 416, 417 and 418 of this Title. The provisions in this Part apply to all childcare children, typically developing and otherwise.

Section 413.2. Definitions

- (a) Child Day care.
- (1) Child day care means care for a child on a regular basis provided away from the child's residence for less than 24 hours per day by someone other than the parent, stepparent, guardian or relative within the third degree of consanguinity of the parents or stepparents of such child. A relative within the third degree of consanguinity of the parent or step-parent includes: the grandparents of the child; the great-grandparents of the child; the greatgreat-grandparents of the child; the aunts and uncles of the child, including the spouses of the aunts and uncles; the great-aunts and great-uncles of the child, including the spouses of the great-aunts and great-uncles; the siblings of the child; and the first cousins of the child, including the spouses of the first cousins.
- (2) Child day care does not refer to care provided in:
- (i)a summer day camp, traveling summer day camp or children's overnight camp as defined in the State Sanitary Code.
- (ii)a program for school-age children operated solely for the purpose of religious education, sports, classes, lessons or recreation.
- (iii)a facility providing day services under an operating certificate issued by the New York State Office of Children and Family Services (OCFS):
- (iv)a facility providing day treatment under an operating certificate issued by the Office of Mental Health or by the Office for People with Developmental Disabilities; or
- (v)a kindergarten, pre-kindergarten or nursery school for children three years of age or older, or a program for school-age children conducted during non-school hours, operated by a public school district or by a private school or academy which is providing elementary or secondary education or both in accordance with the compulsory education requirements of the Education Law, provided that such kindergarten, pre-kindergarten, nursery school or program is located on the premises or campus where the elementary or secondary education is provided.

Section 413.3. Enforcement of regulations

(a) Types of Enforcement Actions. Enforcement actions which may be undertaken by OCFS include, but are not limited to:

- (1) issuance of written inspection reports which include corrective action plans, requests to submit a corrective action plan to OCFS, and notices of intention to initiate enforcement through the imposition of a fine or the limitation, suspension, termination, revocation, or denial of a license or registration;
- (2) meetings or telephone conversations between a program and OCFS to discuss corrective action plans;
- (3) the holding of hearings to determine if a licensee or registrant has failed to comply with applicable law and regulation which resulted in the assessment of fines, suspension, limitation, revocation, or denial of the license or registration:
- (4) determinations, after hearings, that civil penalties should be imposed;
- (5) determinations to deny, reject, revoke, terminate, suspend or limit a license or registration;
- (6) issuance of orders to cease and desist operation of day care services, commissioner's orders, or orders approved by a justice of the Supreme Court, requiring a person or entity to immediately remedy conditions dangerous to children receiving child day care;
- (7) temporary suspension or limitation of a license or registration upon finding that the public health or child's safety or welfare are in imminent danger;
- (8) requests to the attorney general to seek injunctive relief against licensee or registrant for violations or threatened violations of law or regulation;
- (9) requests to the attorney general to take such action as is necessary to collect civil penalties, seek criminal prosecution, or to bring about compliance with any outstanding hearing decision or order;
- (10) publication in local newspapers of the names and addresses of child day care licensees or registrants whose licensees, registrations or applications for licensure or registration have been rejected, denied, limited, suspended, terminated or revoked, or against whom a fine has been assessed after an administrative hearing;
- (11) referrals to law enforcement, including but not limited to district attorneys, of any child day care provider that has been directed to cease and desist operations by the OCFS pursuant to existing law that has not ceased operations; or
- (12) requests to the district attorney to take such action as is necessary to seek criminal prosecution.

I would like to incorporate volunteers into my program, does a volunteer need a background check to work with the children?

Dear Curious,

The answer is yes, we can find this information in the 413 Definitions, which are part of The New York State Child Care Regulations. In this document section 413.2 (c)(15) gives the definition of what a volunteer is and their potential role in a program. As you will see "All volunteers have the potential for either unsupervised contact or regular and substantial contact with children in care". Due to this potential, we will see volunteers are listed in section 413.4 where the background process is explained. There are also listed on the form OCFS-6000. 413 is a very useful tool in the explanation of the language of parts 414, 416, 417, and 418 of the Regulations. They can be found on the OCFS website.

Child Care Time & Attendance (CCTA)

Submit your timesheets online with the Child Care Time & Attendance (CCTA) System!

We encourage all providers to submit timesheets through the web-based system, CCTA.

There are several **benefits to using CCTA** web-based provider portal such as:

- ⇒ Eliminate the cost of shipping, mailing and purchasing paper products and postal supplies.
- ⇒ Eliminate time delay of using the postal service.
- \Rightarrow TRACK PAYMENTS ON A DAILY BASIS.

It is recommended to use Internet Explorer on desktops or laptops. Most iPads and other hand held tablets are not supported by this system

REMINDER – ALL timesheets have a 60 expiration date from the last date of service. ANY TIMESHEETS that are RECEIVED AFTER the 60 expiration date (electronically or paper) will be RETURNED to provider as NOT PAYABLE

Become a Legally Exempt Provider!

Are you a parent struggling to find childcare? Do you know someone who has been struggling to find childcare? A family member or friend who is 18+ years old, can watch up to 8 children who are all related, and up to 2 children who are not related!

Tips to Enrollment:

- -MUST have a family with an approved child care assistance case
- -MUST complete pre-service training (Non-Relative only)
- **-MUST** submit a complete enrollment packet
- -All boxes/section must be checked/filled out, even if it is N/A
- -Non-Relative providers MUST complete a comprehensive background check
- **-Relative** providers **ONLY** include: Grandparent/Great-grandparent, Sibling who is living in a separate residence, Aunt or Uncle
- -To be classified as "In-Home", care MUST be done in the child's home, not the provider's
- -Enrollment process may take 40 days+

"Cupkin" is printed on the front bottom of the cups.

Hazard: The stainless-steel cups contain levels of lead that exceed the federal lead content ban. Lead is toxic if ingested by young children and can cause adverse health effects.

Sold At: Online at Amazon.com and Cupkin.com from January 2018 through March 2023 for about \$20.
